Hello, my name is Margitta Degner. I work in the Kahlhorst school and in the branch office in Niederbüssau as a school social worker. As a school social worker, I advise parents, students and teachers. As I do not belong directly to the school environment, it can be very helpful if students need a contact person while having problems at school, but also in their circle of friends or family, e.g. in conflicts, bullying, etc.

You are welcome to take advantage of the counseling offers outside of the school, for example as part of a home visit or at any other location.

The counseling service offered by school social work is also aimed at parents seeking advice. We will try to work out a solution together. Sometimes it is necessary to take advantage of further counseling.

For this reason, it is important for my work to maintain contact with social counseling centers such as the youth welfare office, the Cooperative Educational Aid (KEH), educational counseling centers, but also with leisure facilities and other schools.

In order to get to know students outside of counseling, I visit the children during class, in the afternoon when they are being looked after and during school breaks. The task of school social work is also the participation in class conferences, school and teacher conferences, the school development day and the socio pedagogical support of teachers. I also offer participation in parents' evenings or in teaching projects. Goals of school social work:

- Strengthening self-confidence and personal responsibility
- Development of social skills
- Preventive and accompanying support for students and their families
- Socio-educational support and advice for teachers

My office is on the right-hand side in the basement of the Kahlhorst school.
